

As I was driving to work this morning, the song by Matthew West entitled “Do Something” came on my radio (I actually use iTunes). The lyrics struck me, because they say the following:

*I woke up this morning  
Saw a world full of trouble now, thought  
How'd we ever get so far down, and  
How's it ever gonna turn around  
So I turned my eyes to Heaven  
I thought, "God, why don't You do something?"  
Well, I just couldn't bear the thought of  
People living in poverty  
Children sold into slavery  
The thought disgusted me  
So, I shook my fist at Heaven  
Said, "God, why don't You do something?"  
He said, "I did, yeah, I created you!"*

As I said in my sermon on February 21, Jesus came to preach the good news to the world, but he didn't unearth the evil world rulers, nor did he lift the poor and oppressed out of poverty. Christ came to teach us to do these things. So, this leads us back to Matthew West's song: God created us to do something. Therefore, WHAT DO WE DO?

The Mission & Outreach Team of Cross Roads met a few weeks ago, and we discussed several ideas. Some of them you will begin to hear more about in the coming weeks and months, but I have been asked to share just a few of them with you.

First, we will no longer be designating our white bucket offerings each week or month. Instead, we will use the funds from these offerings to meet our obligations for Compassion Children. If there are excess funds each month, the funds will remain in the Mission & Outreach account and will be used for local ministries and outreach to our communities throughout the year. We know there are many in need within our communities and this is where Cross Roads wants its focus to be in 2021.

Second, we will be designing new outreach materials personalized for our congregation which will be used to reach out to those in our communities we want to invite to join us. Some of these materials will involve “New Neighbor Baskets.” These are baskets which will be available at the church for anyone in our congregation who has a new neighbor move in and wants to welcome them to the community and to Cross Roads. All you need to do to get one of these for a new neighbor is contact Linda Kelvington, Shari Heitke, or the church office.

Finally, in coming months you will hear more about how you can get involved in helping to reach out to the businesses in our communities to show them how much we appreciate all they do for us, especially during this pandemic when many have been hard hit by the economic downturn. We need to support them and there are many ways we can do this, which you will hear about more in the near future.

As we are now in the Lenten season, let us consider, instead of giving up something for Lent, we instead find ways to do more; more giving, more outreach, more love, more of anything Jesus caught us (grace and mercy also come to mind).

God created YOU to do something. To care for the poor and homeless, to reach out to those who are oppressed with love and grace, to stand up for the injustices in the world. There is much we can do, maybe too much, but if we start with the single step, just one simple act, it can affect us and those we touch more than we realize. Let's make the motto for Cross Roads in 2021 “Do Something!” Go ahead, get started!

We have officially begun in-person worship. Our worship service begins at 9:30 am.

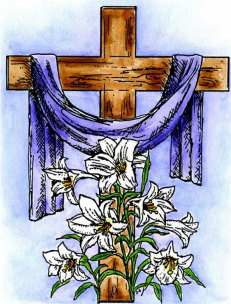

## Easter

Easter will be here before you know it, and unless we see a huge spike in COVID cases in our area, we plan to be open for worship this year. However, as with all things pandemic related these days, worship will be somewhat different than in years past.



We will have THREE (3) worship services this year for Easter, with Holy Communion being celebrated at each one. The service times will be 7:30 am; 9:00 am; and 10:30 am. The 9:00 am service will be our "senior friendly service"

and the 10:30 am service will be our "family friendly service", although you are welcome to attend whichever service you wish.

You will need to register for whichever service you and your family plan to attend in order to make certain we limit the number of people at each service and to ensure we have enough space to properly social distance. And because we will be having three back-to-back services, you are asked to please wait to enter the building until the previous service has dismissed.

Please make sure you indicate the number of people who will be with you and a contact number in the event there are any issues with your registration.

## February 2021 Updates

March is quickly approaching, which means Minnesota Food Share month is soon upon us.

**Minnesota FoodShare** engages thousands of Minnesotans annually via the Minnesota FoodShare March Campaign. Minnesota FoodShare seeks to educate the community about food insecurity and encourages legislators and community decision makers to lend a compassionate and objective voice to public policy debates that impact Minnesota families living in poverty. The [Minnesota FoodShare March Campaign](#) brings together organizations, businesses, faith communities, and individuals to help keep 300 food shelves statewide stocked throughout the year. Minnesota FoodShare has distributed over 18 million dollars to March Campaign participating food shelves throughout the state via the Minnesota FoodShare FoodFund. This fund includes donations secured year-round from corporations, individuals, foundations, and businesses. 100% of donations received by Minnesota FoodShare during the March Campaign go into the FoodFund and are distributed to March Campaign participating food shelves.

\$306,658 distributed to participating food shelves via the Minnesota FoodShare FoodFund

In January, **The Food Pantry** welcomed 5 new families, served 34 children, 60 adults and 13 seniors. 2930 pounds of food was distributed and 630 pounds of food was donated from community members and churches.

**The Wildcat Backpack Program** continues to deliver to Prairie Meadows Headstart program and we also have a few families picking up their backpack food during the week. If you know a family that could benefit from this program, please have them call Ashley at 320-354-5555.

The Link's **Client Outreach** program served 5 families in the month of January. The Link was able to pay rent, a car payment, utility bills and some medical bills for community members. The Link's Household Exchange program was also able to serve 7 families by providing them with necessities to get back on their feet. There have been some amazing donors and dedicated volunteers ensure families get some much needed items including beds, tables, couches and kitchen utensils.
