## November 2021 Updates

The Holiday's are in full swing at The Link! Staff and volunteers have been busy prepping for Thanksgiving and Christmas as well as continuing our regular programming! Thanksgiving baskets were just wrapped up last week and distribution will be Tuesday and Wednesday before Thanksgiving. There were over 75 families signed up to receive these baskets! Christmas sign up has also started. There are a few ways you can help families in need this holiday. The Link distributes gifts, gift cards and Christmas meals to families the week of Christmas. If you would like to participate in purchasing anything from gift cards and gifts to food for the food baskets, please call The Link and let us know what you'd like to do. Also, if you know any families that could use a little help this holiday season, sign up to receive gifts is open until December 2<sup>nd</sup>. This allows families that are shopping some time to get the gifts purchased and to The Link the week before Christmas. Any families signed up are confidential. There is no identifying information shared with the shoppers. There is a system in place to ensure the privacy of each family is respected unless they want to be known.

In October, **The Food Pantry** distributed 2616.5 pounds of food, had 12 new families and served 36 kids, 71 adults and 420 seniors. The Link also served 7 families in **Client Outreach** to assist with everything from rent and utility assistance to gas for medical appointments and money to do laundry.

**The Wildcat Backpack Program** is seeing an increase in numbers for the first time since distant learning took effect. We are currently serving 50 kids between Prairie Meadows, Prairie Woods, the Middle School and High School. If you are looking for non-monetary ways to help, The Wildcat Backpack Program can always use extra non-perishable items including: mac-n-cheese, chef Boyardee meals, applesauce or other fruit pouches, single serve snack bags (chips, cheese its, pretzels, etc.), treats and juice boxes.

**Senior Food Delivery-** The senior food delivery program is designed to help those who are homebound and find it difficult to get food. There are many volunteers who would love to deliver food to anyone in need. If you have any questions as to how this program works, please call Ashley at 354-5555.

**The Community Revival Boutique and Thrift** has seen a significant increase in donations and sales! Currently the store is open Wednesday-Friday from 10-3 and Saturdays from 10-2. Because of the increase in donations and shoppers, we are looking for more volunteers (especially for Saturdays).
