We've all just been handed something very special: a "brand, spanking-new" New Year with which to do some very special things. OR not. It's really up to us.

Newness is something that is very popular in our American culture. Who doesn't enjoy that "new car" smell, that fresh out-of-the-box aroma of a new pair of leather shoes, or the feel of that nice Christmas sweater you just opened?

Even now, New Year's resolutions have that new car smell at the moment. Our resolve is high to make this year different than other years. But if the truth be told, the average time between the moment we make our resolutions and their demise is a sad three weeks. By that time all the newness has been aired out of them – and they become mere chores. It's one of the reasons I don't make resolutions.

Instead, I'd like to offer us a different focus on the year ahead. What are the most important "provisions" that you will need for the journey? When you think about the most challenging times in your life, what are the most important things that have tided you over?

Personally, I can think of some precious things that have gotten me through. The majority of these things take up little or no physical space, which make sense because Jesus always encouraged his disciples to travel light. In Mark 6:8-9, Jesus "charged them to take nothing for their journey except a staff; no bread, no bag, no money in their belts; but to wear sandals and not put on two tunics." His point was to focus them, not to be impoverished, but to clear their vision of material things so that they can clearly see the most precious provisions of all: other people, and the presence of God in those people.

Of the most precious things on my journey, I count the kind presence of friends in dark hours. I stockpile in my mind the sound of their voices. I also hoard up within my soul those moments when I have been transported by beauty far beyond the ordinary. The ring of truth in scripture; a perfect poem, or word of wisdom from a spiritual master. And those transcendent moments when I hear the voice of God through music or song. You know these moments when you experience this soul-stirring moment, as when I baby reacts to their mother's singing.

These are my provisions for the times the wind blows. So, at the beginning of this new journey of 2024, I ask you to contemplate this: Who and what are the real provisions of your life? Think of them, and tuck them away in that special part of your heart that you reserve for precious things.

On December 12, we had a "crossover" Admin Team meeting with the members of the current Admin Board and the new members coming on in 2024. Thanks to Howard Carlsen, Carrie Duke, Dustin Pflipsen and Tom Smith for their faithful service on the board. A big welcome to Jean Ericson, Keith Lippert, Annette Muetzel and Randy Ronning for agreeing to serve on the team. We look forward to another year of working together to serve the congregation of Cross Roads to help fulfill our mission as faithful Christians.

While the Admin Team serves as the overall committee for SPRC, trustees, finance, etc., we have established a subcommittee that will first review and discuss any items or issues relating to our paid staff. Members will be Linda Kelvington, Pat Solheid and Jean Ericson. Linda will continue to be the identified SPRC Liaison. Duane Daby will continue to be the Finance Liaison and Dave Evermann will continue to be the Liaison for Trustee issues. At this juncture, no one has been identified for the Lay Leader position. We decided to function without this position for the time being until such time that someone comes forward to fill the role, or we decide we need to actively recruit someone because we can't function without it.

Also, a "shout out" of thanks to everyone who attended our charge conference on December 10 and approved the budget and compensation package. With Reverend Leslie now having authority to preside at our charge conferences since her ordination, coordinating and conducting the meeting went very smoothly this year. Our final 2024 budget as approved at the December 12 Admin Team meeting will be \$159,334 (as the final property insurance numbers were received).

We won't have our final 2023 finance numbers until January, but it looks like we may finish in a neutral position and even may be slightly "in the black." Thanks to everyone who continues to support Cross Roads Church with their tithes and offerings, and to those who submitted pledges for 2024. Also, on behalf of the Admin Team I'd like to thank Don Ericson, Ron VanNurden, Reverend Leslie and Kendra Pflipsen for finalizing an internal audit for 2022 and bringing their suggestions to the Admin Board. Now that we have the process in place, our audit of 2023 will be completed earlier in the year than our 2022 audit was. It's prudent for us to conduct these audits as a part of being good stewards for the resources that are given to the church by our members.

As we head into 2024 with optimism and hope, we ask for your prayers and support as we provide the oversight for the "inner workings" of Cross Roads Church so we can continue our mission:

The Link's Open House Fundraiser was a great success! We are grateful to each and every one of you that came to support The Link and to all of you that have supported The Link's mission so far in 2023!!!!

The Food Pantry continues to see an increase in need. In November, The Link welcomed 27 new families and served 165 households - distributing a total of 10,067 pounds of food.

Wildcat Backpack and Snack Pantry. The Link is currently serving 93 children each week from NL-S schools! This is an ability to supplement children's food for the weekend when they are not in school. The Link is also currently connecting 29 teachers with snacks for students in their classroom.

**Client Outreach.** Each month, The Link is able to provide support to a number of families facing hardships, such as (but not limited to): job loss, chronic illness, unexpected change in family dynamics and increase in the cost of living. In November, your donations were able to support 7 families by helping with medical bills, gas, utility bills and rental payments along with providing budgeting support, networking and referrals for additional basic needs. Household Exchange. The Household Exchange Program was able to provide 27 families with much needed winter gear, furniture and other household necessities in November.
