Christ is risen! Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia! Now what do we do?

Our Lenten journey is over. We traveled to the upper room on Maundy Thursday with Jesus and his disciples. We heard Jesus say those powerful, effective words that are still effective when we hear them on Sunday mornings, "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of your sins" (Matt. 26:28). We traveled to the foot of the cross on Good Friday and heard Jesus utter a lonely cry of abandonment, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me" (Mark 15:34)? We heard the words of finality that Jesus spoke with his last breath, "It is finished!" (John 19:30). And we traveled to the empty tomb to hear again about the group of women that traveled there early on the first day of the week to find it empty. We heard once more the words of the angels at the empty tomb, "He is not here, but has risen" (Luke 24:6). The final, culminating day of the resurrection is over. Now what do we do?

The month of April reminds us that Easter is more than just one day. Easter is an "every Sunday" celebration during which we come together to receive the fruit of the cross and resurrection of Jesus—the forgiveness of sins and the certainty of eternal life with God. Easter is also an "every day" celebration in which we live each day trusting in God through Christ, knowing that Jesus is "the resurrection and the life" (John 11:25) for us.

So what do we do now as we go forth from the empty tomb? Let us follow the example of the first witnesses of the empty tomb. After the two angels reminded Mary Magdalene and the other women that Jesus had risen, Luke tells us that "they remembered the words, and returning from the tomb they told all these things to the eleven and to all the rest" (Lk 24:8-9, emphasis mine). They went forth from the tomb changed by the resurrection of Jesus. They went forth from the tomb to bring an "every day" witness of God's power.

Where do we go when we leave the empty tomb? Let us follow the example of Jesus' first disciples. After Jesus walked through locked doors to appear to the disciples and to show himself to Thomas, many of the disciples went back to their fishing business (John 21:1-14). They went back to their vocations or stations in life and took the witness of the resurrection with them. They lived in the joy of the resurrection of Jesus while carrying out the daily, ordinary labor and responsibilities given to them.

Similar to the women at the empty tomb and the eleven disciples, we are "every day" witnesses and participants in the resurrection of Jesus. We believe and are baptized. We have the hope of eternal life. We have the joy of the resurrection living inside of us. Also like the women at the empty tomb and the disciples, we have vocations or stations in life that God has given to us as gift. Most of us are not fishermen, but all of us have one or more of these callings: father, husband, mother, wife, son, daughter, brother, sister, grandparent, employee, retiree, friend, and neighbor. Each of these callings comes with a set of duties and responsibilities. As Christians, by God's grace we wrap the daily duties and responsibilities of our vocations in the joy, love, peace, and forgiveness of Christ. Hopefully others will take notice and God will use our faithful work by giving us opportunities to "tell all these things to all the rest" (Luke 24:9).

Now, we go forth from Easter Sunday and the celebration of the empty tomb free as God's forgiven children in Christ. Go forth empowered by God's Spirit living and active within us to live in the joy of the resurrection as "every day" witnesses.

April Mission Focus - The Reel Hope Project



The REELHOPE Project's mission is:

A forever family for every child.

Their goal is to make a video for all youth in our focus states who are experiencing foster care and awaiting an adoptive family. Each reel is provided free of charge to the representing county or adoption agency as a recruitment resource for prospective adoptive families. Their vision is to mobilize the faith community to step into adoption, foster care, and prevention efforts. They serve as a bridge between Church and State, partnering broadly on both sides to see an end to youth waiting for families. They believe in approaching this need from both ends of the spectrum – preventing kids from entering the system and finding families for kids awaiting adoption.

All excess funds in April will go towards helping them create the videos.

THE FOOD PANTRY

In February, The Food Pantry served 180 Householdsincluding 306 adults, 191 children and 61 seniors-distributing a total of 9,720 pounds of food!



CLIENT OUTREACH and HOUSEHOLD EXCHANGE

Each month, The Link is able to provide support to a number of families facing hardships, such as (but not limited to): job loss, chronic illness, unexpected change in family dynamics and increase in the cost of living.

In February, your donations were able to support 31 families by helping with medical bills and prescription cost, utility bills and rental payments along with providing budgeting support, networking and referrals for additional basic needs. The Link also provided 17 families with basic household needs including clothing, furniture and winter gear!

WILDCAT BACKPACK AND SNACK PANTRY

The Link is currently serving **96 children** each week from NL-S schools! This is an ability to supplement children's food for the weekend when they are not in school.

The Link is also currently connecting **31 teachers** with snacks for students in their classroom.
