Is it really, though? I mean, sure, our culture is highly proficient in and dedicated to promoting romance. I've lost count of the number of jewelry commercials on TV today, and I tip my cap to the advertising folks.

But while romance is as abundant as ever, it seems that love is a different story at the moment. It seems that love is harder to come by in the public sphere. Violence always leads off the news broadcasts. And public discourse has become hostile to the extent that political differences have even driven wedges between close friends.

But as people united in Christ, we are called by God to love others even if it's not the most popular thing to do. Fortunately, the Bible is a great resource to help us do this! One of the best descriptions of love in the Bible is the passage I quoted above, written by the Apostle Paul in his first letter to the Corinthian church. These words to the Corinthians are some of the most enduring words in the Bible, and are familiar to many people because they are often read at weddings.

Despite that common use, though, the implications of the kind of love described in 1 Corinthians 13 are wide-ranging. Loving with this sort of patience and gentleness invites others into our lives, providing fertile ground for relationships to grow. Strangers we may at first lump into a category become individual people we truly see, know, and appreciate. Love like Paul describes is able to topple the walls of fear and discord that seem to be so effectively separating people right now.

This is the kind of love God calls us to offer to the world not just this February, but every day of every month of every year. Let this love be our Valentine to everyone, showing the love God has for us in Jesus Christ by offering that same love to others.

February Missions

The Missions Team will have two special projects in February:

1) School Lunch Debt

According to the Education Data Initiative, there are 1.54 MILLION students who can't afford their school lunch. A 2019 School Nutrition Association survey shows more than 75% of school districts in the U>S> had school meal debt. That came out to be about \$262Million in outstanding meal balances every year.

The excess mission collections for the month of February will be donated to the NLS schools to help address their school lunch debt. Please give generously.

2) Lenten Project

A special project for Lent has been created. Lent begins February 22nd. There will be special Lenten packets available in church beginning mid February to help you get ready. A white trash bag with a purple ribbon will be available to each family or person who wishes to participate. The project is called "Forty Items for Forty Days". Everyone needs an opportunity to clean out their closets. We're asking you to place ONE item in the bag each day of the 40 days of Lent. On Sunday, March 26th, bring your bag to church and place on the steps in the sanctuary. Pastor Leslie will say a special blessing over the items collected. Then you can take your bag to the donation place of your choosing! If you don't want to take it, the Missions Team will ensure they get donated.

Admin Team Notes

If you are on the Admin Team (or if you'd just like to attend), mark your calendars for the next meeting which will be Wednesday, February 8. This is a deviation from the normal meeting date.

At the last Admin Team meeting, we worked on finalizing our Facility Policy. This policy will give us more structure about the use of our building and grounds. For example, there will be a form for members to complete if they wish to borrow any church property (tables for graduation parties, as an example). This will help us maintain better control over our assets and ensure they are returned back to us. After we finalize the Facility Policy, we will focus on a Finance Policy and a Personnel Policy.

Hopefully everyone has been attending worship in person or watching on-line for Pastor Leslie's sermon series on stewardship based on Adam Hamilton's book, "Enough." The sermons are thought provoking and prompt self-reflection. I hope you're enjoying it as much as I am.

Lots of good things are on the docket for the upcoming weeks. Tuesday's Table will likely be over by the time this newsletter is published, but I'm sure that I can accurately predict that it was a rousing success and the soup was great! Another Bloodmobile is scheduled for March 10. And, if you can believe it, Lent begins on February 22. Come for coffee on February 8. If you can help the youth group with a meal, check out the available dates in the weekly email.

The Link Updates

2022 brought big change as we said goodbye to our Executive Director, Chasity Ommotd. Chasity served The Link as the Outreach Director for 6 years before becoming the director in 2019. She moved with her family to sunny Arizona, but continues to provide support and answer questions to ensure a smooth transition. We miss her, but wish her the best on her new adventure and know her passion and love for The Link will always remain and her connection to our community will always be strong.

In 2022, The Link was able to serve 60 families with common household needs with our **Household Exchange Program**. The Household Exchange program takes in donations to provide families when they are getting back on their feet.

On average throughout 2022, **The Food Pantry** served 64 households monthly (including, on average, 95 adults, 52 children and 25 seniors) and distributed a total of 40,481 pounds of food. The need of food has increased significantly the past couple months, requiring The Link to increase their food budget to meet the needs of the people served.

The Wildcat Backpack Program is currently serving 84 children. Each week, students from the NL-S High School pack the bags and deliver them to each school to ensure our students nutritional needs are met on the weekends when they are not in school. The Link's **Client Outreach** program served 86 families in 2022 by helping with medical bills, utility bills and rental payments. This program also connected families with financial resources outside of The Link to help with bigger bills and necessities, including housing for homeless families. With the communities support, we were also able to help 78 families with our Christmas Joy program.
