March is Women's History Month. It is a time to remember and celebrate the many, many, many accomplishments of women in our country, and even around the world.

John Wesley licensed many women to be preachers in the Methodist movement which began in England in the 1700's. His views on the values of women in ministry began with his mother, Susanna. She was said to have instilled in John, as well as his brother Charles, a deep appreciation for women and their intellectual and spiritual gifts as preachers of the gospel. Being a female clergy in the United Methodist Church in the 21st century, I am grateful to all the female clergy who came before me, paving the way and braving much discrimination in order that I might be free to serve.

The UMC began ordaining women back in 1956, a full twelve years before the Methodist Church merged with the United Evangelical Brethren Church to become the United Methodist Church. This historic event allowing women to be ordained into the Methodist Church occurred right in our own backyard, in Minneapolis, during the General Conference of 1956. Yet even after the change to the Book of Discipline allowing ordination of women, female clergy struggled to be offered appointments with the Church.

Today, we have almost 12,000 active and retired female clergy within our denomination. But there is still much work to be done. In the southern United States, where I recently relocated from, the average number of clergy who are female in any given Annual Conference is roughly 35%. Compare that to the almost 50% of female clergy in the Minnesota Annual Conference, we understand why the work of equality for female clergy remains unfinished. In addition, female clergy have suffered continued discrimination by many people, male and female, lay and clergy alike.

I consider myself blessed to be here with the congregation of Cross Roads, who has opened its heart and doors to me as female in ministry. I am thankful for all of the support and kindness shown to me since my arrival last summer. Yet I know there are still those who do not believe in equality for women, at any level of society, whether it be in the church, in other work settings, or in the home. Women have contributed so much to our world, with much of those contributions done in the background without any recognition whatsoever. So, to all of you women in our church, I want to say "Thank You" for all you have done to better your churches, your workplaces, society, and your homes. To you men I would say, support the women in your life, be it wives, daughters, sisters, aunts, etc. We have gifts and abilities God has given to us to do a wide range of work, and we could certainly use all the support we can get.

So during the month of March I would challenge you to reach out to a woman in your life that has made an impact on you, and let her know you thank her for all of the hard work she has done. Let's face it, without women, none of us would be here.

JANUARY 2024 IMPACT FROM THE LINK

THE FOOD PANTRY

In January, The Food Pantry served **169 Households**- including 273 adults, 157 children and 58 seniors-distributing a total of **9,053** pounds of food!



CLIENT OUTREACH and HOUSEHOLD EXCHANGE

Each month, The Link is able to provide support to a number of families facing hardships, such as (but not limited to): job loss, chronic illness, unexpected change in family dynamics and increase in the cost of living.

In January, your donations were able to support **19 families** by helping with medical bills and prescription cost, utility bills and rental payments along with providing budgeting support, networking and referrals for additional basic needs. The Link also provided **14 families** with basic household needs including clothing, furniture and winter gear!

WILDCAT BACKPACK AND SNACK PANTRY

The Link is currently serving **96 children** each week from NL-S schools! This is an ability to supplement children's food for the weekend when they are not in school.

The Link is also currently connecting **29 teachers** with snacks for students in their classroom.
